At the hospital, he leads the diagnostic practicum rotation completed by all speech, language pathology students and supervises graduate student clinicians completing their externship.

He has served on several local and national boards and committees including Chair, American Board of Swallowing & Swallowing Disorders; Chair, NY State Board for Speech-Language Pathology & Audiology; Past President of the NYS Speech-Language-Hearing Association.

He currently serves as a member on the Board of Directors of the International Dysphagia Diet Standardization Initiative known as IDDSI and shares his passion for helping people with dysphagia by educating practitioners both locally and internationally.
