

## James A. Phalen, MD



Dr. James A. “Jaime” Phalen is a Clinical Professor of Pediatrics at the Uniformed Services University, and Adjunct Professor of Pediatrics at UT Health San Antonio. Dr. Phalen earned his medical degree from the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences F. Edward Hébert School of Medicine in Bethesda, Maryland. He completed a pediatrics residency from Keesler Medical Center at Keesler Air Force Base in Biloxi, Mississippi. He subsequently completed a developmental-behavioral pediatrics fellowship at The Children’s Hospital/JFK Partners in Denver, Colorado in 2005.

Dr. Phalen was a charter member of the American Academy of Pediatrics PREP® DBPeds Editorial Board. While stationed at Wilford Hall Ambulatory Surgical Center, JBSA Lackland, Texas, he led several interdisciplinary teams: feeding, autism, spina bifida, and NICU graduate.

He was Chief Military Consultant to the Air Force Surgeon General for Developmental Pediatrics. In December 2016, he retired from the US Air Force after 28 years of service. Dr. Phalen is American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) certified in general pediatrics, with subspecialty certification in developmental-behavioral pediatrics. He is a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics and has presented nationally and published in his field. Currently, he works for University Health System in San Antonio, where he continues with teaching pediatric residents and seeing patients full time.
